- xxiii. The Department maintains Grievances record to note the complaints of the students and Floor Incharge staff and in-turn rectifies the Grievances.
- xxiv. The Department provides ID cards for the students throughout the year 2013-2014.
- xxv. The allotment of the class rooms for the students is made during the beginning of every academic year.
- xxvi. Student Rest Room is maintained in the college for sick students to take rest to keep fit and healthy.
